NOTICE OF PROCESS FOR DRAWING NAMES FOR JURY WHEELS

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. §§ 1864(a) and 1866(a), the Clerk of the Court hereby gives notice of the process by which names are periodically and randomly drawn from the master jury wheel and the qualified jury wheel:

Pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1861, all litigants "have the right to grand and petit jurors selected at random from a fair cross section of the community." This Court uses a two-step process to select jurors. First, a master jury wheel is created by selecting names at random from the Mississippi Voter Registration for the counties in this District. Then, names are randomly drawn periodically from the master jury wheel to receive juror qualification questionnaires. Individuals' answers to these questionnaires determine whether they are legally qualified to serve. If so, the names of those persons are put on a second wheel, which is the qualified jury wheel. As prospective jurors are needed for a specific trial or grand jury, juror summonses are sent to persons randomly selected from the qualified wheel. All of these selections are carried out through a properly programmed electronic data processing system for pure randomized selection. The pure randomized process ensures that the mathematical odds of any single name being picked are substantially equal.
