Pre-scheduling delivery and installation in more than five business days advance if possible is preferred. There are no on-site court personnel to receive deliveries.


The following lists site conditions and supplemental requirements for delivery and installation of drapery for the Thomas G. Abernethy Federal Building in Aberdeen, Mississippi. Drapery vendors shall provide all materials, equipment, and labor to deliver and install drapery in the locations within the courthouse indicated in the specifications provided by the court. A pre-bid walk-thru will be scheduled for all interested bidders.

- 1. Delivery hours at the courthouse may be scheduled between 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Monday to Friday except for Federal holidays. A staff member of the court will meet you on-site to oversee the delivery.
- 2. Delivery may begin after May 15 for use of small Judge Elevator or stairs and after July 15 for use of Public Elevator. Dates may vary depending on elevator construction completion dates. Installer should be prepared to store items if needed.
- 3. The courthouse has a loading dock. Deliveries may be made at the loading dock or from a surface parking lot that is 6" below the 1st floor level of the courthouse. The 1st floor level is accessible by a dolly curb cut ramp near the parking lot. Refer to the attached site plan and photos. Both are accessed from the street through security gates.
- 4. Access to the court loading dock is through the post office security vehicle gate and parking area.
- 5. Access to the curb ramp is through a narrow van security gate and into the parking lot. Adjacent residences frequently have vehicles parked along the street.
- 6. Provide all personnel necessary to properly guide delivery trucks through the security gates and to the loading dock or curb ramp. It is the installer's responsibility to verify the delivery truck can make the turn radiuses and enter the gates without causing damage. Any damage shall be repaired by the installer at no cost to the Court.
- 7. Drapery shall be delivered through the back of the courthouse as indicated in the attached drawings. Deliveries may not be made through the front doors and city streets may not be blocked for deliveries.
- 8. Some items to be delivered to the 2nd and 3rd floors of the courthouse may not fit in the elevators, for example, large conference tables may not fit. Those items must be delivered via an adjacent stairwell. Dimensions for the elevator and stairwell are noted in the attached floor plan and photos. Additional dimensions may taken prior to installation by the installer or their representative.
- 9. All interior finishes, materials, and building elements in the path of travel for delivery must be protected from damage. Any damage shall be repaired by the installer at no cost to the Court.
- 10. Lobby walls on first and third floors are original marble and must be protected from any damage. Marble cannot be replaced, and repairs may be difficult. Any damage shall be repaired by the installer at no cost to the Court.
- 11. Attached photos showing installation path conditions were taken during construction.
- 12. The public and judge elevators are being renovated. The shop drawing dimensions are attached. Final, installed elevator dimensions should be field verified by the installer or their representative prior to installation.
- 13. All turning radiuses, clear widths, and any dimensional information needed for installation shall be field verified by the installer or their representative prior to installation.
- 14. Pre-installation site visits may be scheduled as needed by the installer with Ms. Patrick.
- 15. Packing materials for delivered drapery and accessories and all trash must be removed from the courthouse premises. Onsite dumpsters are not to be used.









PUBLIC ELEVATOR








A—VIEW OF LOADING DOCK AND DOOR ENTRY




B- VIEW OF MAN ENTRY






D—VIEW THROUGH MAN DOOR INTO BUILDING



E—VIEW OF JUDGE ELEV AND DOORS TO DOCK






